REPLACEMENT: FRONT LOWER ARM – FORD MONDEO BWY. LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:

Replacement: front lower arm – Ford Mondeo BWY. AUTODOC recommends:

• The replacement procedure is identical for the left and right lower control arms.

• All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: FRONT LOWER ARM – FORD MONDEO BWY. USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE:



Secure the wheels with chocks.

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19.





Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.





Unscrew the wheel bolts.



Replacement: front lower arm – Ford Mondeo BWY. Tip:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.



Remove the wheel.

Clean the fastener connecting the ball joint to the steering knuckle. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.





Unscrew the ball joint fastening to the steering knuckle. Use Torx T55. Use a drive socket #18. Use a tap wrench. Use a ratchet wrench.

Remove the fastening bolt. Use a hammer.

Clean the fasteners connecting the control arm to the subframe. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

- Disconnect the ball joint from the steering knuckle. Use a crowbar.

AUTODOC recommends:

• Replacement: front lower arm – Ford Mondeo BWY. Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.

Remove the rear fastener of the control arm. Use a crowbar.

Clean the mounting seats and the thread of the suspension arm. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Install a new arm.





Replacement: front lower arm – Ford Mondeo BWY. AUTODOC experts recommend:

- During the installation process, use only new bolts and nuts.
- Do not damage the ball joint cover.

Install the rear fastener of the control arm. Use a crowbar.

Support the arm. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.

 Ford Mondeo BWY – Do not lower the transmission jack sharply to avoid damaging components and mechanisms of the car.

Screw the front arm fastener. Use a drive socket #15. Use a ratchet wrench.

• Lower the hydraulic transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging assemblies and mechanisms.

Tighten the rear fastener of the control arm. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 Nm torque.+60°

AUTODOC recommends:

• Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.

Tighten the ball joint fastener. Use Torx T55. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 83 Nm torque.

Treat all joints of the arm. Use copper grease.

Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use copper grease.







Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Replacement: front lower arm – Ford Mondeo BWY. After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

Install the wheel.



Replacement: front lower arm – Ford Mondeo BWY. Tip from AUTODOC:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.



Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19.





Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 nm torque.





Remove the jacks and chocks.






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
