# How to change pollen filter on **ALPINA B3 (E46)**– replacement guide

## i Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for: ALPINA B3 (E46) 3.3, ALPINA B3 (E46) 3.3 All-wheel Drive, ALPINA B3 (E46) 3.4 S

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

## REPLACEMENT: POLLEN FILTER – ALPINA B3 (E46). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Torx bit T20
- Ratchet wrench

#### Replacement: pollen filter – ALPINA B3 (E46). AUTODOC recommends:

- Replace the cabin filter at least once every six months, in early spring and autumn seasons.
- Follow the terms, recommendations and requirements of the part operation provided by the manufacturer.
- If the air flow into the cabin has sharply reduced, replace the filter before a scheduled maintenance.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

## REPLACEMENT: POLLEN FILTER – ALPINA B3 (E46). TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- 1 Open the hood.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Unscrew the fasteners of the cabin filter housing cover.



Remove the cabin filter housing cover.

Remove the cabin filter.



6 Remove the rubber strip.



Unscrew the filter housing fastening bolts. Use Torx T20. Use a ratchet wrench.



Disconnect the wiring harness from the cabin filter housing.



9 Remove the cabin air filter housing.

10 Clean the cabin filter housing and cover.



### Replacement: pollen filter – ALPINA B3 (E46). Professionals recommend:

- Remove any debris from the cabin filter housing carefully to prevent contamination of the ventilation duct.
- Do not attempt to clean and reuse the filter it will affect the quality of air cleaning inside the car.

11 Install the cabin air filter housing.

Screw the filter housing fastening bolts. Use Torx T20. Use a ratchet wrench.

13 Install the rubber strip.

Connect the wiring harness to the cabin filter housing.



Insert a new filter element into the filter housing. Make sure that the filter edge fits tight to the housing.



## Replacement: pollen filter – ALPINA B3 (E46). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Follow the air flow direction arrow on the filter.
- Replacement: pollen filter ALPINA B3 (E46). Be sure to position the filtering element correctly. Avoid misalignment.
- Take care to only use quality filters.
