How to change rear brake pads on **AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8)** – replacement guide

This replacement procedure can be used for: AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8) 3.0 TDI quattro, AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8) 2.0 TFSI quattro

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: AUDI A4 Saloon (8K2, B8) 2.0 TFSI Flexfuel quattro



REPLACEMENT: BRAKE PADS – AUDI A4 ALLROAD (8KH, B8). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Wire brush
- Nylon cleaning brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Anti-squeal paste
- Copper grease
- Combination spanner #15

- Drive socket # 13
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench
- Brake caliper wind back tool
- Crow bar
- Wheel chock

Buy tools



Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). Tip from AUTODOC:

- Perform the replacement of brake pads in complete set for each axis. This provides effective braking.
- The replacement procedure is identical for all brake pads on the same axle.
- Warning! Shut down the engine before starting any work AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8).

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:



Open the bonnet. Unscrew the brake fluid reservoir cap.



2

Put the parking brake system into service mode.

3

Secure the wheels with chocks.





4

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



5

Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.



Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8)



Remove the wheel.





8

Clean the brake caliper fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Unscrew the brake caliper fastening. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #13. Use a ratchet wrench.



10

Spread the brake pads. Use a crowbar.



11

Remove the brake caliper.





Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). AUTODOC recommends:

- Tie the caliper to the suspension or to the body with a wire without disconnecting from the brake hose to prevent depressurization of the brake system.
- Make sure that the brake caliper is not hanging on the brake hose.
- Don't press the brake pedal after the brake caliper has been removed. As a result, the piston can fall out from the brake cylinder, and brake fluid leakage and depressurization of the system may occur.
- Check the brake caliper bracket, brake caliper guide pins and boots. Clean them. Replace, if necessary.

Remove the brake pads.

Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). Tip from AUTODOC:

• Measure the brake disc thickness. Upon reaching the wear limit the part must be replaced.



13

Treat the brake caliper piston. Use a nylon cleaning brush. Use a brake cleaner.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.



Press in the brake caliper piston. Use brake caliper wind back tool.

Remove the retaining springs of the brake pads.





16

Clean the brake caliper bracket from dirt and dust. Use a wire brush. Use a brake cleaner.



Replacement: brake pads - AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). Tip:

• After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.



Install the retaining springs of the brake pads.



18

Treat the brake pads in the area where their surface comes into contact with the brake caliper bracket. Use antisqueal paste.



Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• Make sure the disc surface is clean before installing the pads.





Install new brake pads.



Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). Professionals recommend:

• Make sure the pads are installed with linings facing the disc.

Install the brake caliper and fix it. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #13. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 35 Nm torque.



21

Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use copper grease.







Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Replacement: brake pads - AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

Install the wheel.



Replacement: brake pads - AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). AUTODOC recommends:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.

24

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.





25

Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 120 Nm torque.



26

Remove the jacks and chocks.



27

Deactivate the service mode of the parking brake system.

AUTODOC recommends:


 Important! Replacement: brake pads – AUDI A4 Allroad (8KH, B8). Check the brake fluid level in the reservoir and top up if necessary.



Tighten the brake fluid reservoir cap.
