The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: BRAKE CALIPER – AUDI A7 SPORTBACK (4GA, 4GF). LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Brake cleaner
- Copper grease
- Flare nut spanner #10
- Combination spanner #13
- Combination spanner #15
- Drive socket # 13

- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench
- Flat Screwdriver
- Pliers
- Wheel chock




Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- The replacement procedure is identical for the left and right brake calipers on the same axle.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: BRAKE CALIPER – AUDI A7 SPORTBACK (4GA, 4GF). RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE OF STEPS:

- Open the bonnet. Unscrew the brake fluid reservoir cap.
- Secure the wheels with chocks.



- Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.
- Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.
- 5 Unscrew the wheel bolts.

AUTODOC recommends:

Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts.
AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF)

6 Remove the wheel.



Disconnect the parking brake cable from the caliper. Use a flat screwdriver.



- Remove the retaining clip of the parking brake cable. Use pliers.
- Release the parking brake cable. Use a flat screwdriver.
- Spread the brake pads. Use a flat screwdriver.

Unscrew the brake caliper fastening. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #13. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the brake caliper. Use a flat screwdriver.



Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). Professionals recommend:

- When replacing the brake caliper, it is recommended to check the brake hose for damages and, if necessary, to replace it with a new one.
- When replacing a brake caliper it is recommended to replace brake pads, check the state of the brake discs and replace them with new ones if necessary.
- If no new guide pins were supplied in a kit with the new brake calipers, use the old pins.

Unscrew the brake hose from the brake caliper. Use a combination spanner #13.



14 Remove the brake pads.



Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). AUTODOC recommends:

- Immediately plug the brake line open end to prevent fluid leakage and ingress of dirt into the hydraulic system.
- 15 Install the brake pads.
- Install and fix the brake hose into a new caliper. Use a combination spanner #13.

17 Install the brake caliper and fix it.



Tighten the brake caliper fasteners. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #13. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 35 Nm torque.



Install the parking brake cable into the brake caliper bracket. Use a flat screwdriver.



Secure the parking brake cable with the retaining clip. Use a flat screwdriver.



Undo the brake bleeder screw. Use a flare nut spanner #10.

Bleed the brake caliper system. Without starting the engine, press the brake pedal several times until you feel significant resistance.



- Tighten the brake bleeder screw. Use a flare nut spanner #10.
- Tighten the brake caliper bleed screw. Use a flare nut spanner #10. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 10 Nm torque.



Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). Tip from AUTODOC:

- Make sure to set the protection cap on the bleeder valve.
- Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use copper grease.

Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

Install the wheel.



Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). Tip:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

- Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 120 Nm torque.
- Remove the jacks and chocks.



Replacement: brake caliper – AUDI A7 Sportback (4GA, 4GF). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- Check the brake fluid level in the expansion tank and refill if necessary.
- Tighten the brake fluid reservoir cap. Close the hood.
