Hatchback (S07) 1.3 CDTI (L08, L68), OPEL Corsa D Hatchback (S07) 1.4 (L08, L68)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: BRAKE DRUM – OPEL CORSA D. TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Copper grease
- Torx bit T30

- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench
- Wheel chock

Replacement: brake drum – Opel Corsa D. Professionals recommend:

- Replace the brake drums on Opel Corsa D in pair for the rear axle. Disregarding the parts state. It ensures even braking.
- The replacement procedure is identical for the right and left brake drums on the same axle.
- When replacing the brake drums, be sure to also change the brake shoes.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: BRAKE DRUM - OPEL CORSA D. TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

1

Secure the wheels with chocks.

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.



✓ Unscrew the wheel bolts.



Replacement: brake drum - Opel Corsa D. AUTODOC recommends:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.

Remove the wheel.

Clean the brake drum fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Unscrew the brake drum fastening. Use Torx T30. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the brake drum.



Clean the hub. Use a wire brush. Treat the contacting surface. Use copper grease.



10 Install a brake drum.

Tigten the brake drum fasteners. Use Torx T30. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 4 Nm torque.



- Clean the wheel rim mounting seat. Use a wire brush.
- Treat the surface where the wheel rim contacts the brake drum. Use copper grease.



14 Install the wheel.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. Opel Corsa D

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 Nm torque.



17 Remove the jacks and chocks.



Replacement: brake drum – Opel Corsa D. Tip from AUTODOC experts:

 Adjust the gap between the brake shoes and the drum on Opel Corsa D, pressing the brake pedal 10-15 times.
