

FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.6 TDCi, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 2.0 TDCi, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.4, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.6, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.6 Ti, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 2.0, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.8 TDCi, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.8 Flexifuel, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.8, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 2.0 LPG, FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS) 1.6 LPG



REPLACEMENT: ENGINE MOUNTS – FORD FOCUS II ESTATE (DA_, FFS, DS). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Copper grease
- Torque wrench
- Drive socket # E11

- Drive socket # 16
- Drive socket #18
- Ratchet wrench
- Jack
- Fender cover

Replacement: engine mounts – FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS). Tip:

All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: ENGINE MOUNTS – FORD FOCUS II ESTATE (DA_, FFS, DS). RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE OF STEPS:

- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Remove the engine cover.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Replacement: engine mounts FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS). Do not use
 excessive force when removing the part as this may damage it.
- Support the engine in the oil pan area. Use a jack.

Clean the engine mount fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the upper fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.

Unscrew the fasteners that connect the engine mount to the car body. Use a drive socket #18. Use a ratchet wrench.

Unscrew the engine mount fasteners. Use a drive socket #E11. Use a ratchet wrench.



11 Remove the engine mount.

Replacement: engine mounts – FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS). Tip from AUTODOC:

• Carefully check the other engine mounts and replace them if necessary.

Clean the mounting seat of the engine mount. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

13 Install the engine mount to its mounting seat.



Tighten the engine mount fastening bolts. Use a drive socket #E11. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 32 Nm torque.



Tighten the fasteners that connect the engine mount to the car body. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 65 Nm torque.



Treat the engine mount fasteners. Use copper grease.

Tighten the upper fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 55 Nm torque.



Treat the engine mount fasteners. Use copper grease.



Install the engine cover and secure it.

AUTODOC recommends:

- Replacement: engine mounts FORD Focus II Estate (DA_, FFS, DS). Do not use
 excessive force during installation. This may damage the part.
- Make sure the engine cover is properly seated. It should not be displaced with respect to the guiding fasteners.

Remove the fender protection cover.

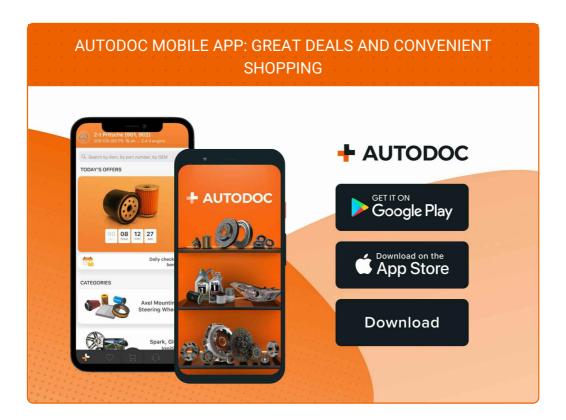
