How to change the glow plugs on the FORD

REPLACEMENT: GLOW PLUGS – FORD TRANSIT MK6 TOURNEO. TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- Nylon brush
- WD-40 spray
- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Electronic spray
- Ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- 7 mm socket
- 8 mm socket
- 10 mm socket

- 13 mm socket
- 10 mm glow plug socket
- Ratchet wrench
- U-joint socket extension
- Clip removal tool
- Gasket scraper
- Microfibre towel
- Paper towels
- Fender cover

Replacement: glow plugs – FORD Transit Mk6 Tourneo. AUTODOC experts recommend:

- The replacement procedure is identical for all glow plugs.
- All the work should be carried out with the ignition switched off.

CARRY OUT THE REPLACEMENT STEPS AS FOLLOWS:

- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to avoid damaging the paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Unsnap the air intake hose clips.



Disconnect the air intake hose from the air filter housing.



Unsnap the air filter cover clips.

6 Remove the air filter cover.



Plug the air intake hose with a microfibre towel to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the system.



Remove the filter element from the filter housing.



Unscrew the fasteners of the air filter housing. Use a 10 mm socket. Use a ratchet wrench.



10 Remove the fastening bolts.

Detach the rubber hoses from the air filter housing.



Remove the oil dipstick.



Plug the oil dipstick hole with a paper towel to prevent dirt from entering the system.



14 Remove the air filter housing.

Clean the connectors of the fuel pressure, MAP and camshaft position sensors. Use an all-purpose cleaning spray.

Unscrew the nut that secures the glow plugs power cable terminal. Use an 8 mm socket. Use a ratchet wrench.



Detach the fuel pressure sensor connector.



Detach the MAP sensor connector.



Detach the camshaft position sensor connector.

Detach the wiring harness fastener and move the harness aside. Use a clip removal tool.

Clean the fasteners of the oil dipstick tube bracket. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the fasteners of the oil dipstick tube bracket. Use an 8 mm socket. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the fastening bolts.

Clean the intake manifold fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Unscrew the fasteners that connect the air intake hose to the intake manifold. Use a 13 mm socket. Use an 8 mm socket. Use a ratchet wrench. Use a U-joint socket extension.



Remove the fastening bolts.

Detach the air intake hose from the intake manifold.



Plug the air intake hose with a paper towel to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the system.

Unscrew the intake manifold fasteners. Use a 10 mm socket. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the intake manifold.

Plug the intake manifold openings with paper towels to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the system.



Unscrew the nuts that connect the power terminals to the glow plugs. Use a 7 mm socket. Use a ratchet wrench.

Remove the power terminal nuts.



Remove the terminals and move the glow plug wire out of the way.



Clean around the glow plug wells to remove any dirt, dust or debris. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the glow plugs. Use a 10 mm glow plug socket. Use a torque wrench.

Replacement: glow plugs – FORD Transit Mk6 Tourneo. Professionals recommend:

- Glow plugs can get stuck over time and break apart when removed.
- Before unscrewing the parts, use a torque wrench to loosen them to avoid exceeding the breakaway torque specified by the car manufacturer.
- If you have reached the breakaway torque but the glow plugs still will not loosen up, you need to seek professional help: a glow plug fragment left inside the well or damage to the thread of the mounting seat can result in costly engine repairs.

Remove the glow plugs.

Treat the new glow plugs. Use ceramic grease.

Install the new glow plugs into their mounting seats.



Tighten the glow plugs. Use a 10 mm glow plug socket. Use a torque wrench. Tightening torque: 13 N·m.



Caution!

- Don't use excessive force when tightening the glow plugs. Overtightening can damage the threaded connection.
- Install the glow plug wire.



Screw on the power terminal nuts.

Tighten the power terminal nuts. Use a 7 mm socket. Use a torque wrench. Tightening torque: 4 N·m.



Clean the intake manifold mounting seat. Use a gasket scraper. Use an all-purpose cleaning spray.



Remove the intake manifold gaskets.

Clean the intake manifold. Use a nylon brush. Use an all-purpose cleaning spray.

Remove the paper towels from the intake manifold openings.



Remove the paper towel from the air intake hose.

Tighten the intake manifold fasteners. Use a 10 mm socket. Use a torque wrench. Tightening torque: 25 N·m.

Remove the microfibre towel from the air intake hose.



Connect the air intake hose to the air filter housing.



75 Snap the air intake hose clips into place.



Remove the paper towel from the oil dipstick hole.

77 Insert the oil dipstick.



- Run the engine for a few minutes. This is necessary to ensure that the components work properly.
 - 79 Switch off the engine.
- Remove the fender cover.
- Close the bonnet.




