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How to change ignition coil on **Opel Astra G F48**– replacement guide

This replacement procedure can be used for:

OPEL Astra G CC (T98) 1.2 16V (F08, F48), OPEL Astra G Caravan (T98) 1.2 16V (F35), OPEL Corsa B Hatchback (S93) 1.2 i 16V (F08, F68, M68), OPEL Astra G Saloon (T98) 1.2 16V (F69), OPEL AGILA (A) (H00) 1.2 16V (F68), OPEL Corsa C Hatchback (X01) 1.2 (F08, F68), OPEL Corsa C Van (X01) 1.2 16V (F08, W5L), OPEL ASTRA G Box (F70) 1.2 (F70)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

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REPLACEMENT: IGNITION COIL - OPEL ASTRA G F48. TOOLS YOU NEED:



- Electronic spray
- Torx bit T30
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench

- Flat screwdriver
- Crow bar
- Fender cover

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Replacement: ignition coil – Opel Astra G F48. AUTODOC recommends:

- The replacement procedure is the same for the ignition coils of all cylinders.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: IGNITION COIL – OPEL ASTRA G F48. RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE OF STEPS:

1

Open the hood. Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.



Remove the engine cover.



Detach the connector from the ignition coil. Use a flat screwdriver.



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4 Unscrew the ignition coil bracket. Use Torx T30. Use a ratchet wrench.



Pry up the ignition coil. Use a crowbar.



Take out the ignition coil from the spark plug well.



Install the new ignition coil to the spark plug well. Make sure you hear a click indicating that it is locked in place.



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Tighten the ignition coil fastening. Use Torx T30. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 15 nm torque.



Treat the ignition coil connector with electronic spray. The spray will protect the electrical contacts from corrosion, oxidation, and will reduce the contact resistance.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: ignition coil – Opel Astra G F48. After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

Plug in the ignition coil connector.



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Install the engine cover and secure it. Make sure you hear a click indicating that it is locked in place.



Run the engine for a few minutes. This is necessary in order to make sure that the component operates properly. Shut off the engine.



Remove the fender protection cover.



Close the hood.






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
