How to change front strut mount on **VW Golf 4** – replacement guide

This replacement procedure can be used for:

VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.9 TDI, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.9 SDI, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.4 16V, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.8, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.8 T, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 2.3 V5, VW New Beetle Hatchback (9C1, 1C1) 2.0, VW New Beetle Hatchback (9C1, 1C1) 1.9 TDI, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.9 TDI 4motion, VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.8 4motion, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.6, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 2.0, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 2.3 V5, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.9 TDI, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.8, (+ 70)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.



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- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Copper grease
- Combination spanner #18
- Drive socket # 16
- Drive socket # 18
- Drive socket # 20
- Drive socket # 21

- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench
- Hammer
- Hydraulic strut spring compressor
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Fender cover
- Wheel chock

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#### Replacement: strut mount – VW Golf 4. Tip from AUTODOC:

- The replacement procedure is identical for the mounts of the left and right shock struts of the front suspension.
- All mounts of the front shock struts should be replaced simultaneously.
- Be sure to replace all self-locking nuts and bolts during installation.
- Please note: all work on the car VW Golf 4 should be done with the engine switched off.

### CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:



Secure the wheels with chocks.

Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

Unscrew the wheel bolts.







• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.

5

Remove the wheel.



6

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Clean the stabiliser link fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Unscrew the fastener connecting the stabilizer bar with the control arm. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.

Remove the fastening bolt.

9

Disconnect the wiring from the bracket on the shock strut.





10

Clean the fasteners connecting the shock strut to the steering knuckle. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

11

Unscrew the lower fastener connecting the shock strut to the steering knuckle. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a drive socket #18. Use a ratchet wrench.



12

Remove the fastening bolt.

13

Disconnect the steering knuckle from the shock absorber strut. Use a hammer.



14

Lower the car.

15

Open the hood.





Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.

Clean the fasteners of the shock strut upper mount. Use WD-40 spray.



18

Unscrew the top fastening of the shock strut mount. Use a drive socket #21. Use a ratchet wrench.



#### AUTODOC recommends:

 Important! Hold the suspension strut while unscrewing the fastening bolts. VW Golf 4



Remove the suspension strut.

Set the shock absorber strut on the spring compressor tool.





#### Replacement: strut mount – VW Golf 4. Tip:

- Note that when using a spring compressor, spring coils need to be securely gripped, compressing the spring on the opposite sides.
- Ensure the correct position of the spring in the retainer.
- Make sure that the spring coils tightly entered the lock handles.

Compress the spring.

Treat the shock strut rod. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.


Remove the strut piston rod nut. Use a drive socket #20. Use a ratchet wrench.





Remove the top strut mount.





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Decompress the spring.

Remove the assembled shock strut.



Install the shock strut into the wheel arch.



31

Screw the top fastening of the shock strut mount. Use a drive socket #21. Do not tighten it.

#### AUTODOC recommends:

 VW Golf 4 – To avoid injury, hold the suspension strut while screwing in the fastening bolts.



Tighten the upper fastener of the shock absorber strut mount. Use a drive socket #21. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 nm torque.

Remove the fender protection cover.

#### Close the hood.



35

Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.



Prop up the steering knuckle. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.

Fix the shock absorber strut on the steering knuckle. Use a hammer.

Install the fastening bolt.

Tighten the lower fasteners connecting the shock strut to the steering knuckle. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 Nm torque.+90°



#### AUTODOC recommends:

• Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.



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Connect the wiring to the bracket on the shock strut.

Remove the support from under the steering knuckle.



#### AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: strut mount – VW Golf 4. Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.

Install the fastening bolt.

Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer bar with the control arm. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 15 Nm torque.+90°







• Important! Hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts. VW Golf 4

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 120 Nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.






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
