This replacement procedure can be used for: HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1) 2.5 CRDi

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: HYUNDAI Santa Fe II (CM) 2.2 CRDi

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REPLACEMENT: FUEL FILTER – HYUNDAI H-1 VAN (A1). TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Combination spanner #19
- Oil filter cup socket #76-14 F
- Ratchet wrench

- Flat Screwdriver
- Fuel line pliers
- Fluid container
- Fender cover

Buy tools

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Replacement: fuel filter – HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Ensure adequate ventilation of the workplace. Fuel vapors are poisonous.
- Please note: all work on the car HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1) should be done with the engine switched off.

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Detach the fuel pressure sensor connector. Use fuel line pliers. Use a flat screwdriver.



- Clean the fasteners of the fuel supply lines. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.
- Squeeze the clips and detach the fuel supply lines from the fuel filter housing. Use fuel line pliers. Use a flat screwdriver.



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Replacement: fuel filter – HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1). Professionals recommend:

- Be careful! Fuel may leak from the filter housing and hoses.
- Unscrew the fuel filter bracket fixing bolts. Use a combination spanner #19.



Remove the fuel filter together with its bracket.



Unscrew the water-in-fuel sensor.



9 Prepare a container for fluids.

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Unscrew the fuel filter bracket. Use the 76-14 F socket. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the fuel filter fastening bracket. Remove the fuel filter.



Replacement: fuel filter – HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1). AUTODOC experts recommend:

• Be careful! Fuel may leak from the filter housing and hoses.

Install a new fuel filter. Install the fuel filter fastening bracket.



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Replacement: fuel filter – HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1). AUTODOC recommends:

- Make sure that the fuel filter is positioned correctly. Consider the fuel flow direction mark.
- During installation, take care to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the fuel filter housing.
- Attention! Use quality components. HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1)

Screw in the fuel filter mounting bracket. Use the 76-14 F socket. Use a ratchet wrench.



Install the new fuel filter together with its bracket.



Screw in the water-in-fuel sensor.



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Screw the fixing bolts of the fuel filter bracket. Use a combination spanner #19.



- Clean the fuel filter. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.
 - Connect the fuel lines to the fuel filter and lock the fastening clips.



Attach the fuel pressure sensor connector.



- Remove the fender protection cover.
- Close the hood.


Replacement: fuel filter – HYUNDAI H-1 Van (A1). Tip:

• Before starting off, switch the ignition on and off several times. This should be done to activate the fuel pump to make it pump fuel through the fuel system.

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Shut off the engine.

AUTODOC recommends:

• To protect the environment from pollution, be sure to dispose of the used filters at special collection points.



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
