How to change front wheel bearing on **Seat Leon 1P1** – replacement guide

## (i) Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for:

SEAT Leon Hatchback (1P1) 1.6 TDI, SEAT Altea (5P1) 1.6, SEAT Altea (5P1) 2.0 FSI, SEAT Altea (5P1) 1.9 TDI, SEAT Altea (5P1) 2.0 TDI 16V, SEAT Toledo III (5P2) 1.6, SEAT Toledo III (5P2) 2.0 FSI, SEAT Toledo III (5P2) 1.9 TDI, SEAT Toledo III (5P2) 2.0 TDI 16V, SEAT Altea (5P1) 2.0 TDI, SEAT Leon Hatchback (1P1) 1.6, SEAT Leon Hatchback (1P1) 2.0 FSI, SEAT Leon Hatchback (1P1) 2.0 TDI 16V, (+ 37)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

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## REPLACEMENT: WHEEL BEARING – SEAT LEON 1P1. LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Ceramic grease
- Copper grease
- Torque wrench
- Drive socket # 16
- Drive socket # 21
- 12-point socket # 24
- XZN socket bit #12

- Torx bit T30
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Tap wrench
- Hammer
- Impact screwdriver
- Crow bar
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Wheel chock

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#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

- Do not re-use the bearing assembly of your Seat Leon 1P1 car.
- The wheel hub bearing replacement procedure is identical for both wheels on the same axle.
- Please note: all work on the car Seat Leon 1P1 should be done with the engine switched off.

### CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

Open the bonnet. Unscrew the brake fluid reservoir cap.



- Secure the wheels with chocks.
- Loosen the fastener of the driveshaft. Use 12-point socket No.24. Use a tap wrench.



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Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the car.



### Replacement: wheel bearing – Seat Leon 1P1. Professionals recommend:

- If you are using a jack, make sure it rests on a flat surface without any unevenness.
- Be sure to additionally secure the car with jack stands.

Unscrew the wheel bolts.



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#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts.

7 Remove the wheel.

Spread the brake pads. Use a crowbar.



Clean the brake caliper bracket fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the brake caliper bracket fasteners. Use a drive socket #21. Use a ratchet wrench.



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11 Remove the fastening bolts.



Remove the brake caliper together with its bracket.



#### Replacement: wheel bearing – Seat Leon 1P1. Tip:

- Tie the caliper to the suspension or to the body with a wire without disconnecting from the brake hose to prevent depressurization of the brake system.
- Make sure that the brake caliper is not hanging on the brake hose.
- Don't press the brake pedal after the brake caliper has been removed. As a result, the piston can fall out from the brake cylinder, and brake fluid leakage and depressurization of the system may occur.
- Check the brake caliper bracket, brake caliper guide pins and boots. Clean them.
   Replace, if necessary.

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Clean the fasteners connecting the ball joint to the suspension control arm. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the fasteners connecting the ball joint to the control arm. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.



Clean the brake disc fastener. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



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Unscrew the brake disc fastening. Use Torx T30. Use an impact screwdriver.



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17 Remove the brake disc.



Disconnect the ball joint from the control arm.



- Unscrew the fastener connecting the drive shaft to the wheel hub.
- Remove the fastening bolt.
- 21 Detach the driveshaft from the steering knuckle.



Replacement: wheel bearing – Seat Leon 1P1. AUTODOC experts recommend:

• Make sure that the drive shaft is not unloaded (when the car is jacked).

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Prop up the steering knuckle. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.



Clean the wheel hub fastener. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the wheel hub bolts. Use XZN #12. Use a tap wrench.



Remove the fastening bolts.



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Remove the hub and the bearing together, since they are made as an assembly. Use a hammer.



Clean the hub bearing mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Treat the wheel hub mounting seat. Use copper grease.



Install the new wheel hub together with the bearing.


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30 Install the fastening bolts.



Tighten the wheel hub bolts. Use XZN #12. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 70 Nm torque.



Clean the splines of the drive shaft CV joint. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Treat the splines of the driveshaft CV joint. Use copper grease.



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Remove the support from under the steering knuckle.



#### AUTODOC recommends:

- Replacement: wheel bearing Seat Leon 1P1. Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.
- 35 Install the drive shaft.

Install and tighten the drive shaft bolt. Use 12-point socket No.24. Use a ratchet wrench.



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Clean the ball joint mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Attach the ball joint to the control arm.



Tighten the fasteners connecting the ball joint to the control arm. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 Nm torque.



Treat the fasteners of the ball joint. Use copper grease.



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Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use ceramic grease.



Install the brake disc.



Tighten the brake disc fastening. Use Torx T30. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 4 Nm torque.



Install the brake caliper together with its bracket.



Install the fastening bolts.



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Tighten the brake caliper bracket fasteners. Use a drive socket #21. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 190 Nm torque.



Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use ceramic grease.



Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



#### AUTODOC recommends:

• After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

Install the wheel.



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#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

 Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. Seat Leon 1P1

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



51 Lower the car.



Tighten the bolt connecting the drive shaft to the wheel hub. Use 12-point socket No.24. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 70 Nm torque.+90°



Tighten the wheel bolts using a criss-cross pattern. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 120 Nm torque.

Remove the jacks and chocks.



## Replacement: wheel bearing – Seat Leon 1P1. Tip from AUTODOC:

- Without starting the engine, press the brake pedal several times until you feel significant resistance.
- Check the brake fluid level in the expansion tank and refill if necessary.

Tighten the brake fluid reservoir cap. Close the hood.






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
