The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: ENGINE MOUNTS – MERCEDES-BENZ CLS (C219). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Copper grease
- Torque wrench
- Drive socket # 10

- Drive socket # 16
- Ratchet wrench
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Fender cover

Replacement: engine mounts – MERCEDES-BENZ CLS (C219). AUTODOC experts recommend:

• All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: ENGINE MOUNTS – MERCEDES-BENZ CLS (C219). USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE:

- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Clean the engine mount fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the upper fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.

5 Remove the fastening bolt.



- 6 Lift the car using a jack or place it over an inspection pit.
- Undo the fasteners of the oil pan lower cover. Use a drive socket #10. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the oil pan cover.



Clean the engine mount fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.






Unscrew the lower fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.



11 Remove the fastening bolt.



Support the engine in the oil pan area. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.



Remove the engine mount.



Replacement: engine mounts – MERCEDES-BENZ CLS (C219). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• Carefully check the other engine mounts and replace them if necessary.

Clean the mounting seat of the engine mount. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Install the engine mount to its mounting seat.



16 Install the fastening bolt.



Screw in the lower fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.



18 Remove the hydraulic transmission jack.

AUTODOC recommends:

- Replacement: engine mounts MERCEDES-BENZ CLS (C219). Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.
- Tighten the lower fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 50 Nm torque.



20 Install the fastening bolt.



Screw in the upper fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.



Tighten the upper fastener of the engine mount. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 50 Nm torque.

Reinstall the oil pan lower cover.



Tighten the fasteners of the oil pan lower cover. Use a drive socket #10. Use a ratchet wrench.



- Lower the car.
- Remove the fender protection cover.
- Close the hood.



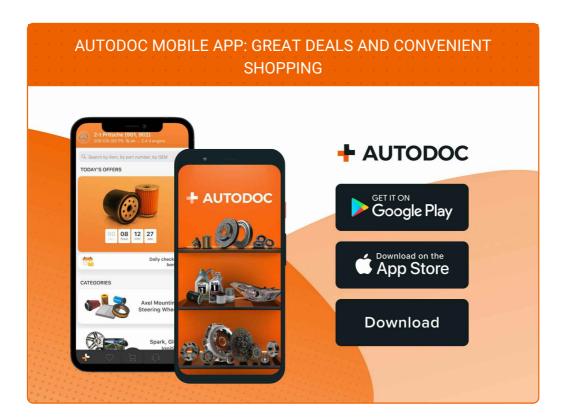
