How to change engine oil and filter on a car – replacement tutorial

## THINGS YOU MAY NEED:



- Suitable engine oil
- A new oil filter
- A new drain plug
- A set of the necessary tools
- An oil filter removal tool

- A waste oil container
- Torque wrench
- Oil-resistant work gloves
- A cleaning agent

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## **AUTODOC** experts recommend:

• Replace the oil filter every time when changing motor oil.





The oil filler. This is located on the top of the engine



The cap is usually labelled accordingly

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The oil dipstick. It is located in the engine oil pan and sends the data on the oil level to the dashboard via the ECU



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Instead of a dipstick, some vehicles are equipped with an electronic sensor

# Important!

- Vehicles with automatic transmission may have 2 dipsticks in the engine bay
- One is used to check the engine oil level, and the other to check the transmission fluid level
- Do not mix them up
- The oil filter. This can be designed as a cartridge that's inserted into the housing on the engine block or made as a separate one-piece spin-on component



The oil filter may be located on either side of the engine



If the oil filter is installed on the underside of the engine, you'll need to remove the engine splash guard



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On some cars, the splash guard doesn't need to be removed, because a special service cover is provided for easy access to the filter



The drain plug. It is located under the engine in its oil pan



To access the underside of the vehicle, use a car lift, or an inspection pit or ramp or a jack



#### Please note!

• When using a jack you also need to use jack stands

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Make sure that the car is in a completely level position. This way, the oil can be drained evenly from all parts of the engine



Oil filters from different manufacturers may vary in design. So it's advisable to use a universal wrench



## **AUTODOC** recommends:

- Change the oil while the engine is still warm
- Warm oil has a higher fluidity

14 Unscrew the oil filler plug



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Pull up the oil dipstick



16 Clean the working area



Unscrew the oil filter cap or the filter itself



Take the oil filter out of its housing

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# Be careful!

• Prevent dirt from entering the filter mounting seat

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Place the waste oil container under the drain plug



Clean the working area



21 Unscrew the drain plug



# Important!

- Proceed with care to avoid spilling the oil
- Wait until the oil has completely drained from the drainage hole



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Clean the oil filter seat



If the filter is a spin-on style one, lubricate its seal with some fresh oil



25 If the filter is a cartridge style one, remove it from its mounting seat on the cap



Remove the O-rings



Clean the mounting seat of the cartridge



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Install new 0-rings and a new filtering element



Prepare a new drain plug with a new gasket



Clean the working area



Tighten the drain plug using a torque wrench to the manufacturer's recommended torque



Remove the waste oil container



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Reinstall the engine splash guard



Install the oil filter and tighten it using a torque wrench to the manufacturer's recommended torque



Insert a funnel into the oil filler



## Please note!

- Only use the oil type approved by the car manufacturer
- Pour new oil into the engine in the amount recommended by the car manufacturer



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Check its level with the dipstick from time to time



## **AUTODOC** recommends:

• Check the oil level with the dipstick with the car standing on a flat, even surface

Extract the dipstick and wipe off the old oil



Insert the dipstick as far as it can go and wait for a few seconds



Extract the dipstick and inspect it without turning it upside down



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
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Wipe the dipstick and put it back in its place



Remove the funnel and screw on the oil filler cap



Start the engine and let it run for 30 seconds



During this time, the engine oil will be distributed throughout the system



Shut down the engine and wait for a couple of minutes

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Recheck the engine oil level and correct it, if necessary



## Please note!

- The oil level should be between the Min and Max marks
- As soon as the procedure is completed, reset the service interval



Alternatively, you can make a note of what mileage the maintenance job was done at



If your vehicle is not equipped with an oil dipstick, the oil level is displayed on the dashboard



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
