
How to change steering rack gaiter on a car – replacement tutorial

YOU MAY NEED THE FOLLOWING:



- a new steering rack boot
- a set of suitable tools
- all-purpose cleaning spray
- WD-40 spray

- clic-R collar pliers
- a torque wrench
- a ball joint puller
- a measuring tool








Please note!

- The steering rack boot protects the rack shaft and inner tie rod end from dirt and water
- The dust boot loses its elasticity over time, which leads to it getting damaged





Turn the steering wheel as far as it will go to access the component



AUTODOC recommends:

- Before getting down to work, measure how far the tie rod is screwed into the tie rod end
- This value affects the toe angle
- After the dust boot replacement, the tie rod should be reinstalled in its original position
- You can make a mark on it to guide you when fitting a new part

To replace the dust boot, you will need to disconnect the tie rod end from the steering knuckle and the tie rod or unscrew the tie rod from the tie rod end



Clean the working area



Measure the distance from the beginning of the threaded portion on the tie rod to the tie rod end, not to the lock nut



Important!

 This is because the distance to the lock nut will vary depending on the thickness of the lock nut

6 Detach the tie rod end from the steering knuckle



Unscrew the tie rod end from the tie rod



Remove the lock nut carefully so as not to erase the mark



Please note!

- In many cases, the tie rod end doesn't have to be removed
- 9 Unscrew the tie rod from it

Loosen or remove the clamp that fastens the dust boot



Caution!

- While carrying out the work, hold the tie rod end firmly so as not to damage its ball joint
- Secure the tie rod end and unscrew the tie rod from it



Remove the dust boot fasteners and take the boot out



Clean the steering rack shaft of old grease and dirt and apply some new grease








AUTODOC experts recommend:

• Check the condition of the tie rod end, tie rod axle joint, and the steering rack





Make sure the boot fits tightly to its mounting seats and is secured reliably



Check that the clamps are installed correctly and that they hold the dust boot firmly in place



Screw on the lock nut, using your mark as reference

Treat all the parts and fasteners with an anti-corrosion agent before reinstalling them



Screw the tie rod end onto the tie rod according to your mark or maintaining the required length



Important!

- After finishing the work, be sure to align the wheels using a special alignment machine
- Tighten all fasteners to the torque recommended by the car manufacturer



Treat the fasteners with an anti-corrosion agent

Make sure that the wheel mounting surface is clean and smooth to prevent wheel imbalance



Treat it with an anti-corrosion agent


