REPLACEMENT: FUEL FILTER - NISSAN TRADE BOX BODY / ESTATE. LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Drive socket # 10
- Ratchet wrench
- Flat Screwdriver

- Phillips screwdriver
- Pliers
- Fender cover

Replacement: fuel filter – NISSAN TRADE Box Body / Estate. AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Ensure adequate ventilation of the workplace. Fuel vapors are poisonous.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: FUEL FILTER - NISSAN TRADE BOX BODY / ESTATE. USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE:

- 1 Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- 3 Slide the filter cover clips. Use a flat screwdriver.



Take off the filter lid.

5 Demount the air filter.



- Disconnect the crankcase ventilation hose from the air duct.
- Loosen the air intake fastening. Use a flat screwdriver.



Detach the vacuum pipe. Use pliers.



Unscrew the fuel filter bracket fixing bolts. Use a drive socket #10. Use a ratchet wrench. Use a Phillips screwdriver.

Remove the fuel filter together with its bracket.



- Clean the fasteners of the fuel supply lines. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.
- Loosen the fastening clamps of the fuel filter pipes. Use pliers.



Detach the tubes from the fuel filter.



Replacement: fuel filter – NISSAN TRADE Box Body / Estate. AUTODOC experts recommend:

• Be careful! Fuel may leak from the filter housing and hoses.

Unscrew the lower cap of the fuel filter.



Remove the fuel filter.



Put the old filter cartridge in the container.



Clean the fuel filter housing and the cover. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



18 Install a new fuel filter.

Replacement: fuel filter – NISSAN TRADE Box Body / Estate. Professionals recommend:

- During installation, take care to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the fuel filter housing.
- Take care to only use quality filters.





20 Install the rubber strip.

Install the lower cap onto the new fuel filter.



Install the new fuel filter together with its bracket.

Attach the tubes to the fuel filter. Use pliers.



Tighten the fastening clamps of the fuel filter pipes. Use pliers.



Screw the fixing bolts of the fuel filter bracket. Use a drive socket #10. Use a ratchet wrench. Use a Phillips screwdriver.



Attach the vacuum pipe. Use pliers.



27 Install the air filter.

- Reinstall the air filter cover. Fasten it.
- Lock the retaining clips of the air filter housing cover. Use a flat screwdriver.



Secure the fastener of the air intake duct. Use a flat screwdriver.



Connect the crankcase ventilation hose to the air duct.



- Remove the fender protection cover.
- Close the hood.
