

How to change rear shock absorbers on **OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98)** – replacement guide

i Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for:

OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 1.6 16V (F67), OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 1.8 16V (F67), OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 2.2 16V (F67), OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 2.0 OPC (F67), OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 2.2 DTI (F67), OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 2.0 16V Turbo (F67), OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98) 1.6 (F67)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

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REPLACEMENT: SHOCK ABSORBERS – OPEL ASTRA G CONVERTIBLE (T98). LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Copper grease
- Drive socket # E20
- Wheel impact socket #17

- Torque wrench
- Tap wrench
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Wheel chock

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


Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98). AUTODOC recommends:

- Both shock absorbers of the rear suspension should be replaced simultaneously.
- The replacement procedure is identical for the left and right shock absorbers of the rear suspension.
- Warning! Shut down the engine before starting any work OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98)

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

Secure the wheels with chocks.



Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.

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4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98).

Professionals recommend:

- To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.
- Remove the wheel.



6.1 Clean the shock absorber fasteners.



6.2 Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



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Support the arm. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.



Unscrew the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a tap wrench.



Remove the fastening bolt.

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Unscrew the upper fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a tap wrench.



Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98). AUTODOC experts recommend:

• To avoid injuries, hold the shock absorber when undoing the fastening bolts.

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11 Remove the shock absorber.



Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98). Tip from AUTODOC:

• Before installing a new shock absorber you should pump it manually 3-5 times.

Place the shock absorber in the wheel arch and secure it.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Important! Hold the shock absorber while screwing in the fastening bolts. OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98)


Screw the upper fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20.



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Raise the hydraulic transmission jack by 10-15 cm. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.



Tighten the top shock absorber fastening. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 Nm torque.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.
- Tighten the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 Nm torque.



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AUTODOC recommends:

• Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.





Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Lower the hydraulic transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging assemblies and mechanisms.
- Clean the wheel rim mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Treat the contacting surface. Use copper grease.



20 Install the wheel.



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Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL Astra G Convertible (T98). Tip:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.





Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.





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
