This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle

This replacement procedure can be used for: OPEL ASTRA J Saloon 1.6 (69), OPEL ASTRA J Saloon 1.7 CDTI (69)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: OPEL Zafira A (T98) 2.0 DI 16V (F75)

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REPLACEMENT: SHOCK ABSORBERS – OPEL ASTRA J SALOON. LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Copper grease
- Impact socket №E18
- Impact socket №E20

- Wheel impact socket #19
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench
- Tap wrench
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Wheel chock

Buy tools

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Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL ASTRA J Saloon. AUTODOC recommends:

- Both shock absorbers of the rear suspension should be replaced simultaneously.
- The replacement procedure is identical for the left and right shock absorbers of the rear suspension.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: SHOCK ABSORBERS – OPEL ASTRA J SALOON. USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE:

1 Secure the wheels with chocks.



Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19.



Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.

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4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



Replacement: shock absorbers - OPEL ASTRA J Saloon. Tip:

- To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.
- Remove the wheel.



6 Clean the shock absorber fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Support the rear suspension beam. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.



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




Unscrew the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a tap wrench. Use a ratchet wrench.



9 Remove the fastening bolt.



Unscrew the upper fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E18. Use a tap wrench. Use a ratchet wrench.



11 Remove the fastening bolt.



Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL ASTRA J Saloon. AUTODOC experts recommend:

• To avoid injuries, hold the shock absorber when undoing the fastening bolts.

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Remove the shock absorber.



Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL ASTRA J Saloon. Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- Before installing a new shock absorber you should pump it manually 3-5 times.
- Clean the shock absorber mounting seats. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Place the shock absorber in the wheel arch and secure it.

AUTODOC recommends:

 Important! Hold the shock absorber while screwing in the fastening bolts. OPEL ASTRA J Saloon

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15 Install the fastening bolt.



Screw the upper fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E18. Use a ratchet wrench.



17 Install the fastening bolt.



Screw in the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a ratchet wrench.



Raise the hydraulic transmission jack by 10-15 cm.



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Tighten the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #E20. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 Nm torque.



Tighten the top shock absorber fastening. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 Nm torque.



Remove the mounting from under the rear axle beam.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL ASTRA J Saloon. Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.

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Treat the shock absorber fasteners. Use copper grease.



Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use copper grease.



Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



Replacement: shock absorbers – OPEL ASTRA J Saloon. Tip from AUTODOC:

• After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

26 Install the wheel.



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AUTODOC recommends:

 Important! Hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts. OPEL ASTRA J Saloon

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19.



Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.





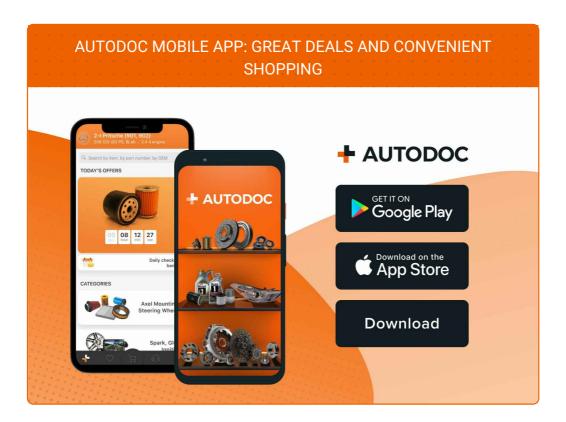
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
