

How to change serpentine belt on **PEUGEOT 2008 Estate** (CU_) – replacement guide


This replacement procedure can be used for: PEUGEOT 2008 Estate (CU_) 1.6 VTi

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: PEUGEOT 207 Hatchback 1.6 16V VTi











AUTODOC recommends:

 Please note: all work on the car – PEUGEOT 2008 Estate (CU_) – should be done with the engine switched off.

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:



Open the bonnet.

Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.



Pull aside the V-ribbed belt tensioner pulley. Use a combination spanner #30.

Remove the V-ribbed belt.



Replacement: serpentine belt – PEUGEOT 2008 Estate (CU_). Tip from AUTODOC:

 Check the condition of the tensioner pulley and idler pulley. Replace them if necessary.

Return the tensioner pulley to its initial position.

Install the V-ribbed belt.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Make sure that the V-ribbed belt fits all pulleys snugly.

Pull aside the V-ribbed belt tensioner pulley. Use a combination spanner #30.

Place the serpentine belt on the crankshaft pulley.



9

Return the tensioner pulley to its initial position.









Remove the fender protection cover.

Close the hood.

Run the engine for a few minutes. This is necessary in order to make sure that the component operates properly.

Shut off the engine.
