This replacement procedure can be used for: PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_) 1.2 PureTech 130

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: PEUGEOT 208 I Hatchback (CA\_, CC\_) 1.2

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## REPLACEMENT: ANTI ROLL BAR LINKS – PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_). TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Copper grease
- Drive socket # 16

- Wheel impact socket #17
- Torque wrench
- Wheel chock

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#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

- Replace the stabiliser links on PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_) in pairs.
- The replacement procedure is identical for both stabiliser links on the same axle.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

## REPLACEMENT: ANTI ROLL BAR LINKS – PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_). USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE:

Secure the wheels with chocks.



Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.

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4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



## AUTODOC recommends:

 $\bullet$  Important! Hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_)

Remove the wheel.



6.1 Clean the stabiliser link fasteners. Use a wire brush.



6.2 Use WD-40 spray.



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7 Unscrew the fasteners connecting the stabiliser link to the stabiliser bar. Use a drive socket #16.



Unscrew the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the shock strut. Use a drive socket #16.



Remove the stabilizer rod.



Replacement: anti roll bar links – PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• Examine stabiliser bushes. Replace them if needed.

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10 Install a new rod, tighten the fasteners.



Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the stabilizer bar. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 43 Nm torque.



Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the shock strut. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 43 Nm torque.



13.1 Treat all joints of the stabiliser link.



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13.2 Use copper grease.



Clean the wheel rim mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Treat the contacting surface. Use copper grease.



15 Install the wheel.



#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. PEUGEOT 2008 II (U\_)
- Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



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Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 100 Nm 17 torque.



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Remove the jacks and chocks.








