
How to change front anti roll bar links on **RENAULT CLIO IV Estate (KH)** – replacement guide

This replacement procedure can be used for: RENAULT CLIO IV Estate (KH) 0.9 TCe 90, RENAULT CLIO IV Estate (KH) 1.5 dCi 90

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: ANTI ROLL BAR LINKS - RENAULT CLIO IV ESTATE (KH). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- Combination spanner #17

- Drive socket # 17
- HEX bit no.H5.
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Tap wrench
- Wheel chock

AUTODOC recommends:

- Replace the stabiliser links on RENAULT CLIO IV Estate (KH) in pairs.
- The replacement procedure is identical for both stabiliser links on the same axle.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: ANTI ROLL BAR LINKS – RENAULT CLIO IV ESTATE (KH). TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- Secure the wheels with chocks.
 - Loosen the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a tap wrench.



Raise the car.

Replacement: anti roll bar links – RENAULT CLIO IV Estate (KH). AUTODOC recommends:

- If you are using a jack, make sure it rests on a flat surface without any unevenness.
- Be sure to additionally secure the car with jack stands.

4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

- To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.
- Remove the wheel.



6 Clean the stabiliser link fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

9 Remove the stabiliser link.

Clean the mounting seats of the stabiliser link. Use a wire brush. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Install a new stabiliser link and tighten the fasteners.



Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the shock strut. Use a drive socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 44 Nm torque.



Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the stabilizer bar. Use a drive socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 44 Nm torque.



Clean the wheel rim mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use ceramic grease.



16 Install the wheel.



Replacement: anti roll bar links – RENAULT CLIO IV Estate (KH). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a ratchet wrench.

Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 Nm torque.



19 Remove the jacks and chocks.
