



How to change front anti roll bar links on **RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_)** – replacement guide

This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle

#### **ⓘ Important!**

This replacement procedure can be used for:

RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 0.9 TCe 90, RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 1.2 16V, RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 1.5 dCi 75, RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 1.5 dCi 90, RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 1.2 TCe 120, RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 1.5 dCi 110, RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) 0.9 TCe 75 (KHNP)

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: NISSAN MICRA III (K12) 1.4 16V

REPLACEMENT: ANTI ROLL BAR LINKS – RENAULT CLIO IV GRANDTOUR (KH\_). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- Combination spanner #17
- Drive socket # 17
- HEX bit no.H5.
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Tap wrench
- Wheel chock

**Buy tools**

**AUTODOC recommends:**

- Replace the stabiliser links on RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_) in pairs.
- The replacement procedure is identical for both stabiliser links on the same axle.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

**REPLACEMENT: ANTI ROLL BAR LINKS – RENAULT CLIO IV GRANDTOUR (KH\_). TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:**

**1** Secure the wheels with chocks.

**2** Loosen the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a tap wrench.



**3** Raise the car.

**Replacement: anti roll bar links – RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_). AUTODOC recommends:**

- If you are using a jack, make sure it rests on a flat surface without any unevenness.
- Be sure to additionally secure the car with jack stands.

**4** Unscrew the wheel bolts.



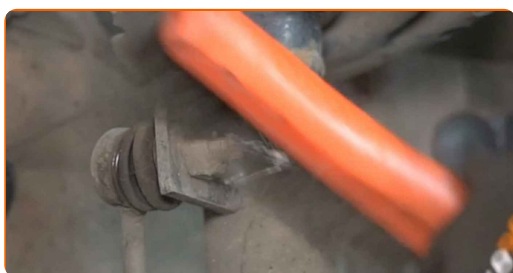
**AUTODOC recommends:**

- To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.

**5** Remove the wheel.



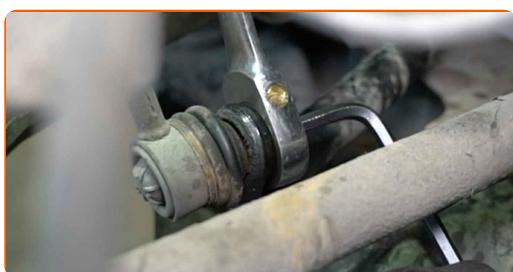
**6** Clean the stabiliser link fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



- 7 Unscrew the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the shock strut. Use a combination spanner #17. Use HEX No.H5. Use a ratchet wrench.



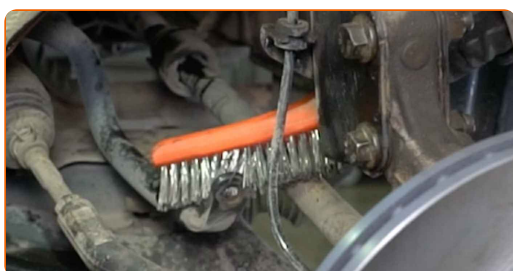
- 8 Unscrew the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the stabilizer bar. Use a combination spanner #17. Use HEX No.H5. Use a ratchet wrench.



- 9 Remove the stabiliser link.



- 10 Clean the mounting seats of the stabiliser link. Use a wire brush. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



**11** Install a new stabiliser link and tighten the fasteners.



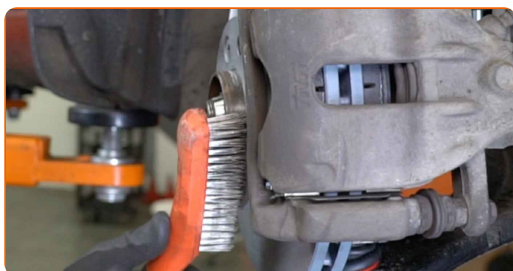
**12** Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the shock strut. Use a drive socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 44 Nm torque.



**13** Tighten the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the stabilizer bar. Use a drive socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 44 Nm torque.



**14** Clean the wheel rim mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use ceramic grease.

Install the wheel.



Replacement: anti roll bar links – RENAULT Clio IV Grandtour (KH\_). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.

17

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a ratchet wrench.





- 18** Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 Nm torque.



- 19** Remove the jacks and chocks.
