This replacement procedure can be used for: RENAULT Twingo I Van 1.2

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: WHEEL BEARING – RENAULT TWINGO I VAN. LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Copper grease
- Drive socket # 30
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Torque wrench

- Tap wrench
- Hammer
- Circlip pliers
- Bush and bearing driver set
- Rubber mallet
- Crow bar
- Wheel chock

Replacement: wheel bearing – RENAULT Twingo I Van. Professionals recommend:

- Do not re-use the bearing assembly of your RENAULT Twingo I Van car.
- The wheel hub bearing replacement procedure is identical for both wheels on the same axle.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: WHEEL BEARING – RENAULT TWINGO I VAN. RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE OF STEPS:

1

Secure the wheels with chocks.



2

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

- Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.
- Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. RENAULT Twingo I Van
- Remove the wheel.



Clean the brake drum. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

Remove the hub bearing protection cap. Use a hammer. Use a crowbar.



Replacement: wheel bearing – RENAULT Twingo I Van. AUTODOC recommends:

- Some cars are not equipped with wheel hub caps.
- Clean the wheel hub fastener. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the wheel hub axle nut. Use a drive socket #30. Use a tap wrench.



10 Remove the brake drum.


Replacement: wheel bearing – RENAULT Twingo I Van. AUTODOC experts recommend:

• Examine the brake drum. Replace it if necessary.





Press out the wheel hub bearing. Use a bush and bearing driver set.



Clean the hub bearing mounting seat. Use WD-40 spray.

Press a new bearing into the wheel hub. Use a bush and bearing driver set.

AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: wheel bearing – RENAULT Twingo I Van. Do not use excessive force during installation. This may damage the part.

Install the wheel hub bearing retaining ring. Use circlip pliers.



Clean the hub bearing mounting seat. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



17 Install the brake drum and fasten it.

Tighten the hub. Use a drive socket #30. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 170 Nm torque.



Replacement: wheel bearing – RENAULT Twingo I Van. Tip:

- The wheel bearing unit must not tilt on the axle pin.
- Install the hub bearing protection cap. Use a rubber mallet.



Treat the surface where the wheel rim contacts the brake drum. Use copper grease.

21 Install the wheel.



Replacement: wheel bearing – RENAULT Twingo I Van. Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.
- Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 nm torque.
