How to change serpentine belt on RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback – replacement guide

This replacement procedure can be used for:

RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback 1.5 dCi 75, RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback 1.5 dCi 90, RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback 1.5 dCi, RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback 1.6 RS

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: SERPENTINE BELT – RENAULT TWINGO II HATCHBACK. TOOLS YOU NEED:



- Torque wrench
- Combination spanner #10
- Combination spanner #16
- Drive socket # 13
- Wheel impact socket #17

- Ratchet wrench
- Clip removal tool
- Fender cover
- Wheel chock

Replacement: serpentine belt – RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback. AUTODOC recommends:

• All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: SERPENTINE BELT – RENAULT TWINGO II HATCHBACK. USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE:

- Open the hood.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Secure the wheels with chocks.



Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.


6 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Important! Hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback
- Remove the wheel.

Remove the wheel arch cover. Use a clip removal tool.



Unscrew the fuel filter bracket fixing bolts. Use a drive socket #13. Use a ratchet wrench.

10 Remove the fuel filter fastening bracket.



Unscrew the fuel filter bracket fixing bolts. Use a combination spanner #10.



Remove the fuel filter fastening bracket.



Pull aside the V-ribbed belt tensioner pulley. Use a combination spanner #16.



14 Remove the V-ribbed belt.

Return the tensioner pulley to its initial position.

Replacement: serpentine belt – RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback. Tip:

 Check the condition of the tensioner pulley and idler pulley. Replace them if necessary.

16 Install the V-ribbed belt.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Make sure that the V-ribbed belt fits all pulleys snugly.
- Pull aside the V-ribbed belt tensioner pulley. Use a combination spanner #16.

Place the V-ribbed belt on the tensioner pulley.



Return the tensioner pulley to its initial position.



20 Install the fuel filter fastening bracket.



Screw the fixing bolts of the fuel filter bracket. Use a combination spanner #10.



Install the fuel filter fastening bracket.

Screw the fixing bolts of the fuel filter bracket. Use a drive socket #13. Use a ratchet wrench.



Install the wheel arch cover to its mounting seat.



25 Install the wheel.

Replacement: serpentine belt – RENAULT Twingo II Hatchback. Tip from AUTODOC:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 105 nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.



- Run the engine for a few minutes. This is necessary in order to make sure that the component operates properly.
 - 30 Shut off the engine.
- Remove the fender protection cover.
- Close the hood.
