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How to change engine oil and filter on **SEAT Terra Estate (24)** – replacement guide



This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle


(i) Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for: SEAT Terra Estate (24) 1.3 D, SEAT Terra Estate (24) 1.4 D

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: VW GOLF III (1H1) 1.9 D

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AUTODOC recommends:

- Replace the oil filter every time when changing motor oil.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.
- Wear gloves to prevent contact with hot liquid.

REPLACEMENT: ENGINE OIL AND FILTER – SEAT TERRA ESTATE (24). TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

Open the hood.

2 Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.

Unscrew the oil filler plug.

Lift the car using a jack or place it over an inspection pit.

AUTODOC recommends:

- The vehicle must be on even keel, and if it is at an angle, the drain plug must be at the lowest point.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

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Put a waste oil container with at least 5 l capacity under the drainage hole.



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Clean the area of the oil pan drainage hole. Use a wire brush. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



Unscrew the drain plug. Use a drive socket #19. Use a ratchet wrench.

Drain the used oil.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Caution! The oil may be hot.



Prepare a container for the old oil filter.



Clean the oil filter. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

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Unscrew the oil filter. Use a chain oil filter wrench.



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Put the old oil filter in the container.



Replacement: engine oil and filter – SEAT Terra Estate (24). AUTODOC recommends:

• Move up the container. The oil starts to drain out of the drainage hole immediately after you have removed the oil filter.



Clean the oil filter seat. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Lubricate the rubber seal of the new filter with a little amount of fresh oil.

Screw the new filter into its place. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 23 Nm torque.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Wait until the oil has completely drained from the drainage hole.

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Clean the area of the oil pan drainage hole.

Screw in the new drainage plug and tighten it. Use a drive socket #19. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 28 Nm torque.



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Clean the area of the oil pan drainage hole. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



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Lower the car.

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Remove the oil filler cap.



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Insert the funnel.




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Pour new oil into the engine in the amount recommended by the car manufacturer.




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Check the oil level 5 minutes after the stop of the engine operation using a dipstick and add oil if necessary.



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
