SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 1.8 TSI, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 1.6 TDI, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 2.0 TDI, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 1.6 TDI 4x4, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 1.8 TSI 4x4, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 2.0 TDI 4x4, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 2.0 TDI RS, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 2.0 TDI / TDI RS 4x4, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 2.0 TSI, SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) 2.0 TSI 4x4

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.










## REPLACEMENT: AIR FILTER – SKODA OCTAVIA III COMBI (5E5). LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Torx bit T25
- Ratchet wrench

- Microfibre towel
- Fender cover

#### Replacement: air filter – SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5). Tip from AUTODOC:

- Follow the terms, recommendations and requirements of the part operation provided by the manufacturer.
- Please note: all work on the car SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5) should be done with the engine switched off.

#### CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Disconnect the crankcase breather hose from the air filter housing.



Disconnect the vacuum hose from the air filter housing.

Undo the fastening screws of the air filter cover. Use Torx T25. Use a ratchet wrench.



Take off the filter lid.



Remove the filter element from the filter housing.



Cover the air intake hose with a microfibre towel to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the system.



Clean the air filter cover and housing.

10 Remove the microfibre towel from the air intake hose.



Insert a new filter element into the filter housing.



#### Replacement: air filter – SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5). Tip:

- Make sure that the filter edge fits tight to the housing.
- Attention! Use quality filters SKODA Octavia III Combi (5E5).
- During installation, make sure to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the air filter housing.

Reinstall the air filter cover. Fasten it.

Screw in the fastening screws of the air filter cover. Use Torx T25. Use a ratchet wrench.



Connect the vacuum hose to the air filter housing.



Connect the crankcase breather hose to the air filter housing.



- Remove the fender protection cover.
- 17 Close the hood.
