REPLACEMENT: FRONT LOWER ARM – VAUXHALL ASTRA MK IV (G) ESTATE (T98). LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Copper grease
- Drive socket # 18
- Combination spanner #18
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench

- Pin punch
- Flat chisel
- Hammer
- Rubber mallet
- Crow bar
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Wheel chock

Replacement: front lower arm – VAUXHALL Astra Mk IV (G) Estate (T98). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- The replacement procedure is identical for the left and right lower control arms.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: FRONT LOWER ARM – VAUXHALL ASTRA MK IV (G) ESTATE (T98). TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

1

Secure the wheels with chocks.



Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.

4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.




AUTODOC recommends:

 Important! Hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. VAUXHALL Astra Mk IV (G) Estate (T98)

Remove the wheel.



Clean all joints of the arm. Use a wire brush. Treat all joints of the arm. Use WD-40 spray.



Replacement: front lower arm - VAUXHALL Astra Mk IV (G) Estate (T98). Tip:

- After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.
- Wear protective goggles.

Unscrew the ball joint fastening to the steering knuckle. Use a drive socket #18. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the fastening bolt. Use a hammer. Use a pin punch.



Unscrew the front arm fastener. Use a drive socket #18. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a ratchet wrench.

Unscrew the rear arm fastener. Use a drive socket #18. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a ratchet wrench.

Release the fastener connecting the ball joint to the steering knuckle. Use a flat metal-working chisel. Use a hammer. Disconnect the ball joint from the steering knuckle.



Remove the arm. Use a crowbar.



Clean the mounting seats and the thread of the suspension arm. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



14 Install a new arm.

Connect the ball joint to the steering knuckle.



Replacement: front lower arm – VAUXHALL Astra Mk IV (G) Estate (T98).

AUTODOC recommends:

- During the installation process, use only new bolts and nuts.
- Do not damage the ball joint cover.
- Install the control arm fasteners. Do not tighten it.



Support the arm. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.

Tighten the ball joint fastener. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 50 nm torque.



Screw the front arm fastener. Use a drive socket #18. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 Nm torque.+75°

- Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.
- Screw the rear arm fastener. Use a drive socket #18. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 90 Nm torque.+75°



AUTODOC recommends:

• Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.

Remove the support from under the arm.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Replacement: front lower arm VAUXHALL Astra Mk IV (G) Estate (T98). Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.
- Treat all joints of the arm. Use copper grease.

Clean the wheel rim mounting seat. Use a wire brush. Treat the contacting surface. Use copper grease.

Replacement: front lower arm – VAUXHALL Astra Mk IV (G) Estate (T98).

AUTODOC experts recommend:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 nm torque.

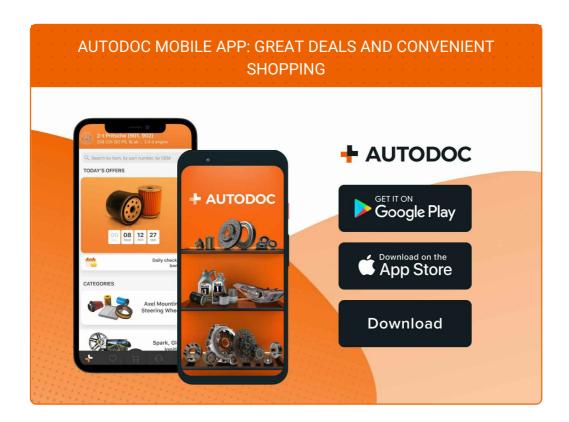
