The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: AIR FILTER – VAUXHALL ASTRA MK V (H) ESTATE (A04). TOOLS YOU NEED:



- Drive socket # 7
- Ratchet wrench

- Microfibre towel
- Fender cover

Replacement: air filter – VAUXHALL Astra Mk V (H) Estate (A04). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Follow the terms, recommendations and requirements of the part operation provided by the manufacturer.
- Warning! Shut down the engine before starting any work VAUXHALL Astra Mk
 V (H) Estate (A04).

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Detach the air intake hose clamp. Use a drive socket #7. Use a ratchet wrench.



Disconnect the air intake pipe from the air filter housing.

Cover the air intake hose with a microfibre towel to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the system.



Detach the fasteners connecting the air pipe and the wiring harness to the air filter housing.



Take off the filter lid.



Remove the filter element from the filter housing.



Glean the air filter cover and housing.

Replacement: air filter – VAUXHALL Astra Mk V (H) Estate (A04). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• Before cleaning the air filter cover and housing, cover the air duct parts, mass airflow sensor (if available), throttle valve with a clean cloth.

Insert a new filter element into the filter housing. Make sure that the filter edge fits tight to the housing.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Replacement: air filter VAUXHALL Astra Mk V (H) Estate (A04). Be sure to position the filtering element correctly. Avoid misalignment.
- Take care to only use quality filters.
- During installation, make sure to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the air filter housing.

Reinstall the air filter cover. Fasten it.

Attach the fasteners connecting the air pipe and the wiring harness to the air filter housing.



Remove the microfibre towel from the air intake hose.



Connect the air intake pipe to the air filter housing.



Fasten the clamp on the air intake hose. Use a drive socket #7. Use a ratchet wrench.



16 Remove the fender protection cover.
