This replacement procedure can be used for: VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93) 1.4 16V, VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93) 1.6 16V

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: OPEL Corsa B Hatchback (S93) 1.4 i (F08, F68, M68)

REPLACEMENT: WHEEL BEARING – VAUXHALL TIGRA MK I COUPE (\$93). LIST OF THE TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- All-purpose cleaning spray
- Bearing grease
- Ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- Drive socket # 24
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Universal puller

- Bush and bearing driver set
- Ratchet wrench
- Flat screwdriver
- Hammer
- Rubber mallet
- Crow bar
- Wheel chock

AUTODOC recommends:

- Do not re-use the bearing assembly of your VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93) car.
- The wheel hub bearing replacement procedure is identical for both wheels on the same axle.
- Please note: all work on the car VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93) should be done with the engine switched off.

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- Secure the wheels with chocks.
- Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the car.

Replacement: wheel bearing – VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93). Professionals recommend:

- If you are using a jack, make sure it rests on a flat surface without any unevenness.
- Be sure to additionally secure the car with jack stands.

4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts.

- Remove the wheel.



Remove the wheel hub nut cap. Use a crowbar. Use a hammer.



Remove the cotter pin securing the hub nut. Use a crowbar. Use a flat screwdriver.

8 Unscrew the hub nut. Use a drive socket #24. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the wheel bearing washer. Use a crowbar.



Remove the wheel hub bearing. Use a crowbar.

Remove the brake drum assembled with the wheel hub bearing.



Replacement: wheel bearing – VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93). Tip from AUTODOC:

• Examine the brake drum. Replace it if necessary.

Remove the inner oil seal of the wheel bearing. Use a crowbar.



Remove the wheel hub bearing. Use a crowbar.



Clean the hub bearing mounting seat.



Remove the inner race of the wheel bearing from the brake drum. Use a universal puller.

Remove the wheel bearing's outer race from the brake drum. Use a bush and bearing driver set.



Clean the hub bearing mounting seat. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



Install a new wheel bearing outer race in the brake drum. Bush and bearing driver set.

Install the new inner race of the wheel bearing into the brake drum. Bush and bearing driver set.

Treat the wheel hub bearing. Use bearing grease.



21 Install a new hub bearing and secure it.



Install the wheel bearing oil seal.



Treat the stub axle. Use all-purpose cleaning spray. Use bearing grease.



24 Install the brake drum assembled with the wheel hub bearing.

Fit the wheel bearing washer.



Screw on the hub nut. Use a drive socket #24. Use a ratchet wrench.



27 Install the wheel.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93)

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.

Spin the wheel to distribute the new grease evenly on the wheel bearings.



Adjust the axial clearance by tightening the adjusting nut. Use a drive socket #24. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 20-25 Nm torque.

Remove the wheel.



Install a new hub nut cotter pin. Use a crowbar.



Install the cap of the hub nut. Use a rubber mallet.



Treat the surface where the wheel rim contacts the brake drum. Use ceramic grease.



36 Install the wheel.

AUTODOC recommends:

 Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93)





Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 110 Nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.

Replacement: wheel bearing – VAUXHALL Tigra Mk I Coupe (S93). AUTODOC recommends:

• Without starting the engine, press the brake pedal several times until you feel significant resistance.



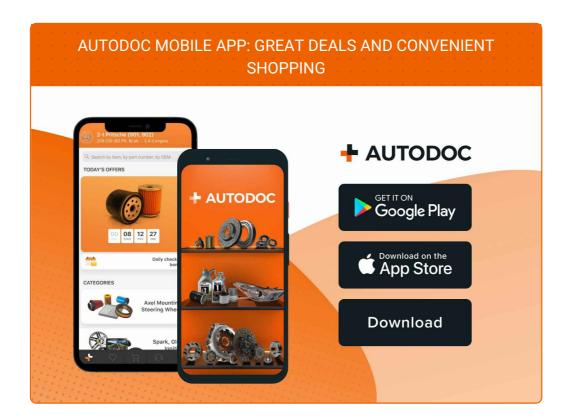
