This replacement procedure can be used for:

VOLVO V60 | Box Body / Estate (155) 2.4 D4 AWD, VOLVO V60 | Box Body / Estate (155) 2.0 D3, VOLVO V60 | Box Body / Estate (155) 2.0 D4, VOLVO V60 | Box Body / Estate (155) 2.4 D5, VOLVO V60 | Box Body / Estate (155) 1.6 DRIVe

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

REPLACEMENT: BRAKE PADS – VOLVO V60 I BOX BODY / ESTATE (155). TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- Nylon cleaning brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Anti-squeal paste
- Ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- Combination spanner #15
- Drive socket # 13

- Drive socket # 15
- Torx bit T50
- Wheel impact socket #19
- Ratchet wrench
- Tap wrench
- Brake caliper wind back tool
- Hammer
- Impact screwdriver
- Wheel chock

Replacement: brake pads – VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155). AUTODOC recommends:

- Perform the replacement of brake pads in complete set for each axis. This provides effective braking.
- The replacement procedure is identical for all brake pads on the same axle.
- Warning! Shut down the engine before starting any work VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155).

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

Open the bonnet.

Unscrew the brake fluid reservoir cap.



- Put the parking brake system into service mode.
- Secure the wheels with chocks.
- Loosen the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19. Use a tap wrench.

6 Raise the car.

Replacement: brake pads – VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- If you are using a jack, make sure it rests on a flat surface without any unevenness.
- Be sure to additionally secure the car with jack stands.

Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.

Remove the wheel.

Clean the brake caliper fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the brake caliper fasteners. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #13. Use a ratchet wrench.



11 Remove the fastening bolts.



12 Remove the brake caliper.

Replacement: brake pads – VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155). Professionals recommend:

- Tie the caliper to the suspension or to the body with a wire without disconnecting from the brake hose to prevent depressurization of the brake system.
- Make sure that the brake caliper is not hanging on the brake hose.
- Don't press the brake pedal after the brake caliper has been removed. As a result, the piston can fall out from the brake cylinder, and brake fluid leakage and depressurization of the system may occur.

Remove the brake pads.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Measure the brake disc thickness. Upon reaching the wear limit the part must be replaced.

Clean the brake caliper bracket of dirt and dust. Use a wire brush. Use a brake cleaner.








Replacement: brake pads – VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155). Tip from AUTODOC:

Check the brake caliper bracket, brake caliper guide pins and boots. Clean them.
 Replace, if necessary.





Press in the brake caliper piston. Use brake caliper wind back tool.



Treat the brake pads in the area where their surface comes into contact with the brake caliper bracket. Use antisqueal paste.

Replacement: brake pads – VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155). Tip:

• Make sure the disc surface is clean before installing the pads.

18 Install new brake pads.



19 Install the brake caliper and fasten it.



20 Install the fastening bolts.



Tighten the brake caliper fasteners. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a drive socket #13. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 35 Nm torque.

- Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use ceramic grease.
- Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



24 Install the wheel.

AUTODOC recommends:

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155)
- Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19. Use a ratchet wrench.

Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 140 Nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Without starting the engine, press the brake pedal several times until you feel significant resistance.
- Check the brake fluid level in the expansion tank and top up if necessary.

Tighten the brake fluid reservoir cap.

Deactivate the service mode of the parking brake system.



Close the bonnet.

Replacement: brake pads – VOLVO V60 I Box Body / Estate (155). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• Slow down smoothly for first 150-200 km after the brake pads replacement. Avoid unneccessary and sharp braking to a stop.
