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How to change front strut mount on **VW Ameo (631)** – replacement guide

This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle

(i) Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for: VW Ameo (631) 1.2, VW Ameo (631) 1.0

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: SKODA OCTAVIA (1U2) 1.6

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REPLACEMENT: STRUT MOUNT – VW AMEO (631). TOOLS YOU'LL NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Copper grease
- High-temperature ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- HEX bit No.H6.
- Combination spanner #18
- Drive socket # 16
- Drive socket # 18

- Drive socket # 20.6
- Wheel impact socket #17
- Ratchet wrench
- Hydraulic strut spring compressor
- Hammer
- Rubber mallet
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Fender cover
- Wheel chock

Buy tools

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Replacement: strut mount – VW Ameo (631). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- The replacement procedure is identical for the mounts of the left and right shock struts of the front suspension.
- All mounts of the front shock struts should be replaced simultaneously.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: STRUT MOUNT – VW AMEO (631). TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

Secure the wheels with chocks.



Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.

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4 Unscrew the wheel bolts.



AUTODOC recommends:

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. VW Ameo (631)
- Remove the wheel.



- 6 Clean the stabiliser link fasteners. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.
- Unscrew the fastener connecting the stabilizer link to the control arm. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.



- Remove the fastening bolt.
- Remove the stabilizer rod.

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Clean the lower fastener connecting the suspension strut to the steering knuckle. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Unscrew the lower fastener connecting the shock strut to the steering knuckle. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a drive socket #18. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the fastening bolt.

Disconnect the ABS sensor wiring.



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Disconnect the steering knuckle from the shock absorber strut. Use a rubber mallet.



- Lower the car.
- Open the bonnet.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Clean the upper fastener of the suspension strut mount. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Loosen the upper fastener of the shock strut mount. Use a drive socket #20.6. Use a ratchet wrench.



AUTODOC recommends:

• VW Ameo (631) – To avoid injury, hold the suspension strut while unscrewing the fastening bolts.

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Remove the suspension strut.



Set the shock absorber strut on the spring compressor tool.



Replacement: strut mount – VW Ameo (631). AUTODOC recommends:

- Note that when using a spring compressor, spring coils need to be securely gripped, compressing the spring on the opposite sides.
- Ensure the correct position of the spring in the retainer.
- Make sure that the spring coils tightly entered the lock handles.

Compress the spring.



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Treat the shock strut rod. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Remove the strut piston rod nut. Use a drive socket #20.6. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the top strut mount.

Install a new top shock strut mount.



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Tighten the shock strut piston rod nut. Use a drive socket #20.6. Use HEX No.H6. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 Nm torque.



Replacement: strut mount – VW Ameo (631). Tip:

- Check to make sure the spring is positioned correctly. Avoid its misalignment.
- Decompress the spring.
- Treat the shock strut rod. Use copper grease.
- Remove the assembled shock strut.



Install the shock strut into the wheel arch.



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AUTODOC recommends:

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. VW Ameo (631)
- Tighten the upper fastener of the shock absorber strut mount. Use a drive socket #20.6. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 Nm torque.



- Treat the upper fastener of the suspension strut mount. Use copper grease.
- Remove the fender protection cover.
- Close the hood.

- Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.
- Treat the mounting seats of the shock strut. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Fix the shock absorber strut on the steering knuckle.



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Prop up the steering knuckle. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.



- Install the fastening bolt. Use a hammer.
- Remove the support from under the steering knuckle.

AUTODOC recommends:

- VW Ameo (631) Do not lower the transmission jack sharply to avoid damaging components and mechanisms of the car.
- Tighten the lower fasteners of the suspension strut. Use a combination spanner #18. Use a drive socket #18. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 Nm torque.+90°



- Install the transverse stabilizer link.
- Install the rod fastening to the stabilizer and tighten it. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 15 Nm torque.+90°



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Connect the ABS sensor wiring.



Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use high-temperature ceramic grease.



Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



AUTODOC recommends:

 Replacement: strut mount – VW Ameo (631). After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

48 Install the wheel.



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AUTODOC recommends:

• Important! Hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts. VW Ameo (631)





Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 120 Nm torque.



Remove the jacks and chocks.





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
