
This replacement procedure can be used for: VW Beetle Hatchback (5C1, 5C2) 1.6 TDI, VW Beetle Hatchback (5C1, 5C2) 2.0 TDI

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: VW Passat B7 Saloon (362) 2.0 TDI












Replacement: serpentine belt – VW Beetle Hatchback (5C1, 5C2). AUTODOC experts recommend:

• All work should be done with the engine stopped.

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:



Remove the wheel.

Pull aside the V-ribbed belt tensioner pulley. Use a combination spanner #16.

Remove the V-ribbed belt.

Return the tensioner pulley to its initial position. Use a combination spanner #16.



Pull aside the V-ribbed belt tensioner pulley. Use a combination spanner #16.

Install the V-ribbed belt.



Replacement: serpentine belt – VW Beetle Hatchback (5C1, 5C2). Tip:

• Make sure that the V-ribbed belt fits all pulleys snugly.

Return the tensioner pulley to its initial position. Use a combination spanner #16.



Install the wheel.

• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when screwing in the fastening bolts.
