How to change rear shock absorbers on **VW Bora Saloon (1J2)** – replacement guide

This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle

### i Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for:

VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.6, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 2.0, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 2.3 V5, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.9 TDI, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.8, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.4 16V, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.9 SDI, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.6 16V, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.8 T, VW Bora Saloon (1J2) 1.6 FSI

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: VW Golf IV Hatchback (1J1) 1.6

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## REPLACEMENT: SHOCK ABSORBERS – VW BORA SALOON (1J2). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Copper grease
- Combination spanner #16
- Combination spanner #21
- Drive socket # 16
- Drive socket # 21
- Wheel impact socket #17

- Ratchet wrench
- Torque wrench
- Tap wrench
- Crow bar
- Vice
- Locking pliers
- Hydraulic transmission jack
- Wheel chock

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#### Replacement: shock absorbers – VW Bora Saloon (1J2). Tip from AUTODOC:

- Both shock absorbers of the rear suspension should be replaced simultaneously.
- The replacement procedure is identical for the left and right shock absorbers of the rear suspension.
- All work should be done with the engine stopped.

# REPLACEMENT: SHOCK ABSORBERS – VW BORA SALOON (1J2). RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE OF STEPS:

1 Secure the wheels with chocks.

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



Raise the rear of the car and secure on supports.

4. Unscrew the wheel bolts.



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### Replacement: shock absorbers – VW Bora Saloon (1J2). Professionals recommend:


• To avoid injury, hold up the wheel when unscrewing the bolts.

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Remove the wheel.



6.1 Clean the shock absorber fasteners.



6.2 Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



Support the rear suspension beam. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.


Unscrew the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a combination spanner #21. Use a drive socket #21. Use a tap wrench.



#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

 Important! Hold the shock absorber while unscrewing the fastening bolts. VW Bora Saloon (1J2)

Remove the fastening bolt.



Remove the mounting from under the rear axle beam.



#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

 VW Bora Saloon (1J2) – Do not lower the transmission jack sharply to avoid damaging components and mechanisms of the car.

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Unscrew the upper fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #16. Use a ratchet wrench.



Remove the shock absorber.



Grip the shock absorber in a vice.

Remove the protective cap of the shock absorber mount. Use a crowbar.



Clean the shock absorber rod fastener. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



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Remove the shock absorber piston rod fastening. Use a combination spanner #16. Use locking pliers.



Remove the shock absorber mount, boot and bump stop.



Replacement: shock absorbers – VW Bora Saloon (1J2). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Thoroughly examine the shock absorber mount, dust boot, bump stop. Replace them if necessary.
- Before installing a new shock absorber you should pump it manually 3-5 times.

Install the mount, boot and bump stop onto a new shock absorber.

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Screw the shock strut piston rod upper fastening. Use a combination spanner #16. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 25 Nm torque.



Release the vice and take out the shock absorber.



Install the protective cap of the shock absorber mount.



Clean the shock absorber mounting seats. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



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Treat the shock absorber mounting seats. Use copper grease.



Place the shock absorber in the wheel arch and secure it.



Replacement: shock absorbers – VW Bora Saloon (1J2). AUTODOC recommends:

- To avoid injury, hold the shock absorber cautiously tight when screwing in the fastening bolts.
- Screw the upper fastener of the shock absorber. Use a drive socket #16.



Support the rear suspension beam. Use a hydraulic transmission jack.

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




- 27 Install the fastening bolt.
- Screw in the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a combination spanner #21. Use a drive socket #21.



Tighten the top shock absorber fastening. Use a combination spanner #16. Use a drive socket #16. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 30 Nm torque.+90°



#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

- Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.
- Tighten the lower fastener of the shock absorber. Use a combination spanner #21. Use a drive socket #21. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 40 Nm torque.+90°



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#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

• Important! Be sure to use new fasteners.





Remove the mounting from under the rear axle beam.



#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

• Replacement: shock absorbers – VW Bora Saloon (1J2). Lower the transmission jack smoothly, without jerks, to avoid damaging components and mechanisms.

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Clean the brake disk surface. Use a brake cleaner.



Replacement: shock absorbers – VW Bora Saloon (1J2). Tip from AUTODOC experts:

• After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

Install the wheel.



#### **AUTODOC** recommends:

• Important! Hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts. VW Bora Saloon (1J2)

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #17.



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Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 120 nm torque.

Remove the jacks and chocks.




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
