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How to change engine oil and filter on VW Caddy II Van (9K9A) – replacement guide


This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle

(i) Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for: VW Caddy II Van (9K9A) 60 1.4, VW Caddy II Van (9K9A) 75 1.6, VW Caddy II Van (9K9A) 1.4

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: VW Polo Hatchback (6N1) 1.0



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- Replace the oil filter every time when changing motor oil.
- Wear gloves to prevent contact with hot liquid.
- Please note: all work on the car VW Caddy II Van (9K9A) should be done with the engine switched off.

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

1 Open the hood. 2 Use a fender pro

Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.



Unscrew the oil filler plug.





Pull up the oil dipstick.





Lift the car using a jack or place it over an inspection pit.

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- The vehicle must be on even keel, and if it is at an angle, the drain plug must be at the lowest point.
- All works should be done with the engine cooled down.

Put a waste oil container with at least 4 l capacity under the drainage hole.

Clean the area of the oil pan drainage hole. Use a wire brush. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Unscrew the drain plug. Use a drive socket #19. Use a ratchet wrench.







Drain the used oil.



Replacement: engine oil and filter – VW Caddy II Van (9K9A). AUTODOC recommends:

• Caution! The oil may be hot.



Clean the oil filter. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Unscrew the oil filter. Use a drive socket #30. Use a ratchet wrench.

Remove the oil filter.





Replacement: engine oil and filter – VW Caddy II Van (9K9A). Professionals recommend:

• Move up the container. The oil starts to drain out of the drainage hole immediately after you have removed the oil filter.




Clean the oil filter seat. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Lubricate the rubber seal of the new filter with a little amount of fresh oil.

Install a new oil filter.

Tighten the oil filter. Remember to observe the recommended tightening torque. Use a drive socket #30. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 23 Nm torque.



AUTODOC recommends:

• Wait until the oil has completely drained from the drainage hole.



Clean the area of the oil pan drainage hole.

Screw in the new drainage plug and tighten it. Use a drive socket #19. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 28 nm torque.

Clean the area of the oil pan drainage hole. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



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Lower the car.

21

Remove the oil filler cap.



22

Insert the funnel.



Pour new oil into the engine in the amount recommended by the car manufacturer.



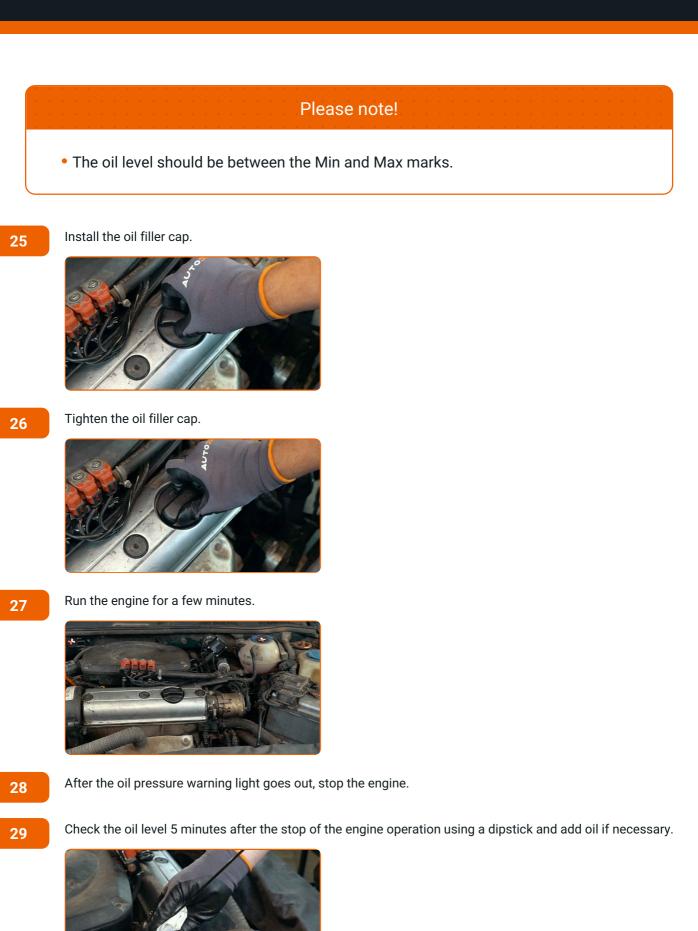
Replacement: engine oil and filter – VW Caddy II Van (9K9A). Professionals recommend:

• Use the oil recommended by the manufacturer.




Check the oil level using the dipstick. Top up oil if necessary.





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
