


How to change ignition leads on VW Golf III

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.



REPLACEMENT: IGNITION LEADS – VW GOLF III HATCHBACK (1H1). TOOLS YOU MIGHT NEED:



- Long nose pliers
- Flat screwdriver
- Phillips Screwdriver

- Microfibre towel
- Fender cover

Replacement: ignition leads – VW Golf III Hatchback (1H1). Tip from AUTODOC:

• All work should be done with the engine stopped.

REPLACEMENT: IGNITION LEADS – VW GOLF III HATCHBACK (1H1). RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE OF STEPS:

- 1 Open the hood.
- Use a fender protection cover to prevent damaging paintwork and plastic parts of the car.
- Unscrew the air filter housing fasteners. Use a Phillips screwdriver.



Remove the air filter housing.



Cover the throttle body with a microfibre towel to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the system.

6 Detach the spark plug wire bracket. Use a flat screwdriver.



Make marks on the distributor cap to indicate the installation order of the spark plug wires.



Disconnect the spark plug wires from the distributor cap.



Replacement: ignition leads – VW Golf III Hatchback (1H1). Tip:

- Be careful to avoid damaging spark plug wires.
- Disconnect the spark plug wires from the spark plugs. Use long nose pliers.



Disconnect the high voltage wire.



Connect new spark plug wires to the distributor cap.

Connect the new spark plug wires to the spark plugs. Use long nose pliers.

Connect the high voltage wire.



Attach the spark plug wire bracket.

Remove the microfibre towel from the throttle body.



Install the air filter housing and fasten it. Use a Phillips screwdriver.

Run the engine for a few minutes. This is necessary in order to make sure that the component operates properly.



- Shut off the engine.
- Remove the fender protection cover.
- Close the hood.
