

How to change fuel filter on VW Polo III Van Box Body / Estate (6V5) petrol – replacement guide

This video shows the replacement procedure of a similar car part on another vehicle

(i) Important!

This replacement procedure can be used for: VW Polo III Van Box Body / Estate (6V5) 1.4

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

This tutorial was created based on the replacement procedure for a similar car part on: VW Lupo / Lupo 3L (6X1, 6E1) 1.0











Replacement: fuel filter – VW Polo III Van Box Body / Estate (6V5). AUTODOC experts recommend:

• Ensure adequate ventilation of the workplace. Fuel vapors are poisonous.

 Please note: all work on the car – VW Polo III Van Box Body / Estate (6V5) – should be done with the engine switched off.

CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:



Open the fuel door.

Unscrew the fuel filler cap.



3

Raise the car.


















Replacement: fuel filter – VW Polo III Van Box Body / Estate (6V5). AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Remember, it is important not to mix up the input and output of the filter. Arrows on the filter indicate the direction of fuel flow.
- During installation, take care to prevent dust and dirt from getting into the fuel filter housing.
- Attention! Use quality filters VW Polo III Van Box Body / Estate (6V5).

Screw in the fuel filter mounting bracket. Use a Phillips screwdriver.

Clean the fasteners of the fuel supply lines. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.

Connect the fuel supply lines to the fuel filter.

Clean the fuel lines. Use all-purpose cleaning spray.



14

Take the fluid container away from under the fuel filter.



15

Lower the car.

16

Tighten the fuel filler cap.





Close the fuel door.








