### **Important!**

This replacement procedure can be used for:

The steps may slightly vary depending on the car design.

**REPLACEMENT: TRACK ROD END – VW TRANSPORTER  
V VAN (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH). TOOLS YOU NEED:**



- Wire brush
- WD-40 spray
- Brake cleaner
- Copper grease
- Ceramic grease
- Torque wrench
- Combination spanner #15
- Combination spanner #24
- Drive socket # 21
- Wheel impact socket #19
- Ratchet wrench
- Ball joint puller
- Vernier caliper
- Wheel chock

**Buy tools**

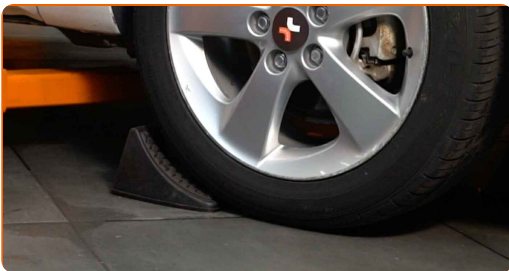
Replacement: track rod end – VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH).  
 AUTODOC experts recommend:

- Replace tie rod ends in pairs.
- The replacement procedure is identical for the right and left tie rod ends.
- Please note: all work on the car – VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH) – should be done with the engine switched off.

## CARRY OUT REPLACEMENT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

1

Secure the wheels with chocks.



2

Loosen the wheel mounting bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19.



3

Raise the front of the car and secure on supports.

**4** Unscrew the wheel bolts.



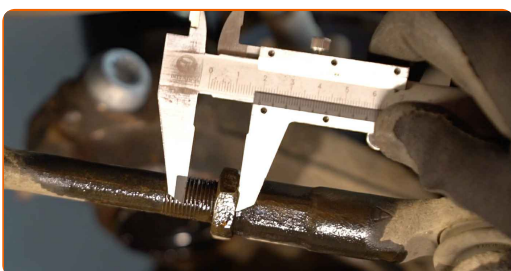
**AUTODOC recommends:**

- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while unscrewing the fastening bolts. VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH)

**5** Remove the wheel.



**6** When deinstalling, mark or measure the precise position of the ball joint on the track rod, or count the number of turns in order to prevent misalignment afterward. Use a vernier caliper.



**7** Clean the lock nut that connects the tie rod to the tie rod end. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

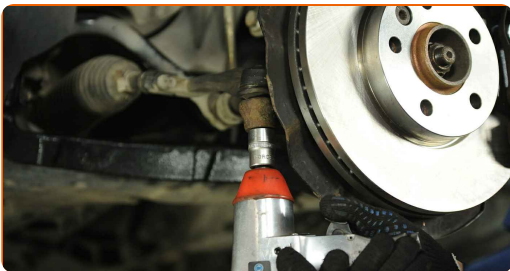
- 8** Loosen the lock nut securing the tie rod end to the tie rod. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a combination spanner #24.



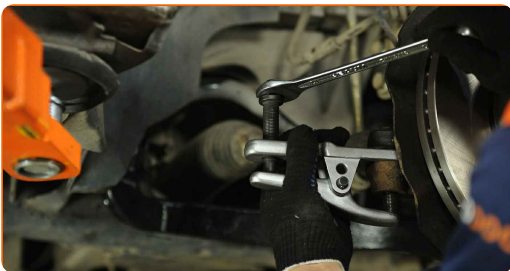
- 9** Clean the fastener connecting the tie rod end to the steering knuckle. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.



- 10** Unscrew the end fastening nut to the steering knuckle. Use a drive socket #21. Use a ratchet wrench.

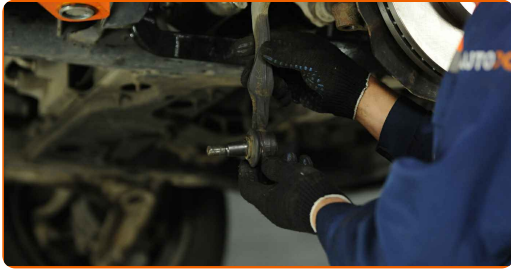


- 11** Disconnect the tie rod end from the steering knuckle. Use a ball joint puller.



**12**

Screw the end out of the tie rod.

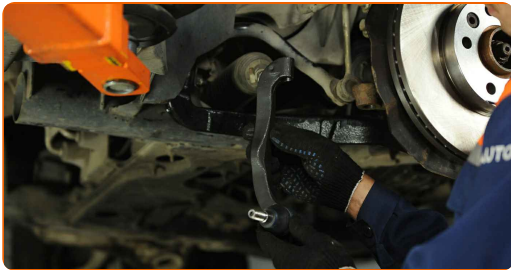


**13**

Clean the mounting seats of the tie rod end. Use a wire brush. Use WD-40 spray.

**14**

Screw on a new tie rod end.



**Replacement: track rod end – VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH).  
Tip from AUTODOC experts:**

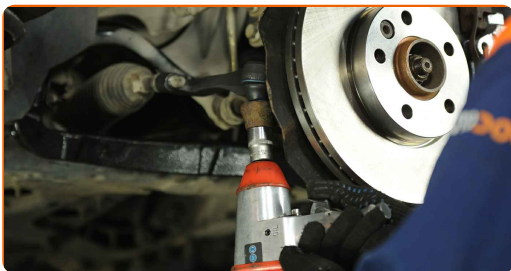
- While installing the steering rod end remember to make the same number of turns or to leave the same length of thread showing as per your measurements.

**15**

Connect the tie rod end to the steering knuckle.

**16**

Tighten the fastening nut connecting the tie rod end to the steering knuckle. Use a drive socket #21. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 Nm torque.+90°



- 17 Tighten the tie rod end locknut. Use a combination spanner #15. Use a combination spanner #24. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 60 nm torque.



- 18 Treat all tie rod end connections. Use copper grease.



- 19 Treat the surface where the brake disc contacts the wheel rim. Use ceramic grease.



- 20 Clean the brake disc surface. Use a brake cleaner.





**AUTODOC recommends:**

- Replacement: track rod end – VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH). After applying the spray, wait a few minutes.

**21**

Install the wheel.



**AUTODOC recommends:**

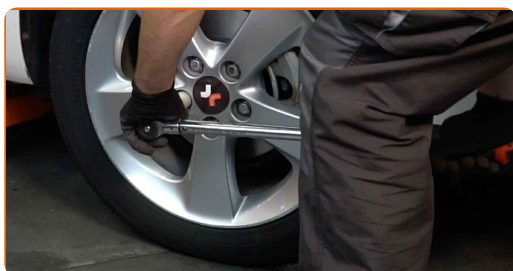
- Warning! To avoid injury, hold the wheel while screwing in the fastening bolts on the car. VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH)

**22**

Screw in the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19.



- 23** Lower the car and working in a cross order, tighten the wheel bolts. Use wheel impact socket #19. Use a torque wrench. Tighten it to 180 Nm torque.



- 24** Remove the jacks and chocks.



Replacement: track rod end – VW Transporter V Van (7HA, 7HH, 7EA, 7EH).  
Tip from AUTODOC experts:

- Check and adjust wheel alignment if necessary.
